

Figs. 1 and 2 are exercises especially adapted for the shoulders and chest—the arms being extended behind, raised and lowered



alternately from the level, as shown, to the height on a line with the head.

Figs. 3, 4, 5 and 6 show the exercises for strengthening the spine, arms and chest—the movements being made in the form of a circle over and around the head.

Fig. 7, for the arms and wrists—the band passing across the back, the arms being straightened and bent alternately; the chest should be always thrown well forward.

Fig. 8, for the wrists—the arms straight out from the shoulders, the handles being held perpendicularly, then stretch the hand *very slowly*. This is one of the finest exercises known for strengthening the muscles of the wrists and arms.

Note.—In exercising, always grasp the handles below the band, and hold them perpendicularly; throw the chest well forward, and keep the mouth slightly open that the lungs may have full play




